“Come and See”

John 1:35-42

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John 10:10, “...I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.” (NIV)

In Jesus, I can have a full life – a bold life!

Everyone ends up somewhere, but few people end up somewhere on purpose.

We have passion to live a full and bold life, but we lack a pathway.

Psalm 16:11, “You make known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence...” (NIV)

Jesus provides us with a Life Path.

Jesus is the boldest person who ever lived, so we need to learn from him.

John 1:35-39, “35 The next day John was there again with two of his disciples. 36 When he saw Jesus passing by, he said, ‘Look, the Lamb of God!’ 37 When the two disciples heard him say this, they followed Jesus. 38 Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked, ‘What do you want?’ They said, ‘Rabbi’ (which means ‘Teacher’), ‘where are you staying?’ 39 ‘Come,’ he replied, ‘and you will see’ ...” (NIV)

Jesus’ Question to Us: What do you want?

Jesus’ Invitation to Us: Come and See.

John 11:25, “...I am the resurrection and the life...” (NIV)

John 14:6, “...I am the way and the truth and the life...” (NIV)

1 John 5:12, “Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.” (NIV)

To experience Jesus is to experience life.

John 1:39, “‘Come,’ he replied, ‘and you will see.’ So they went and saw where he was staying, and they spent that day with him. It was about four in the afternoon.” (NIV)
